I've also been meeting with the other Wisconsin district governors, to make sure our state projects also remain strong and provide examples for districts around the world, of what Lions can do when they focus on serving their communities and beyond.

○ △ Deadlines Approaching Quickly

Tax Reminder: Club officers are reminded that the annual federal tax filing deadline for Lions Clubs is November 15th. Every club in the United States must file the appropriate IRS Form 990—whether it's Form 990-N, 990-EZ, or the full 990—depending on annual revenue. Filing on time helps maintain your club's tax-exempt status and ensures continued good standing with both Lions International and the IRS. Clubs that miss the deadline for three consecutive years risk automatic revocation of their exemption. Please confirm your filing status early and submit your return before November 15th to avoid penalties or loss of nonprofit recognition.

Peace Poster Reminder: Clubs should have their Peace Posters judged locally **based on** this year's theme, "Together As One." Each club needs to select one winning poster and ensure it's properly labeled with the student's and club's information. The winning poster must be submitted to the District Governor and postmarked by November 15th for districtlevel judging. This deadline is firm so that the district winner can advance to the multipledistrict and international competition rounds. Let's celebrate our youth artists and showcase how we all can come together as one through their creative visions of peace!

Mental Health Awareness Week

This past October, Lions around the world kicked off Mental Health Awareness Week, and I'm proud that many of our district clubs took part in activities to raise awareness about mental health in our communities. These local efforts—combined with events across the globe—did not go unnoticed. If your club participated, please remember to report your activity on the Lions Portal so your service can be counted!

© District Goals & Progress

Each year, our district sets goals to strengthen our service potential and leadership. Here's where we stand:

- Service Reporting: Currently 58% of clubs have reported activities on the Lions Portal so far since July 1. Our district goal is 80%, but my personal hope is to see 100% participation!
- Membership: Our goal is to show a **net growth of +20 in the district**. Currently, we are at an **unofficial +6**, thanks to several recent inductions—great work, Lions! Please work to retain members, but if you have to drop members for any reason, please do so right away so we don't have a massive reduction in June.
- LCIF Donations: Last year, 27 of our 43 clubs made donations to LCIF. Our goal this year is 32 clubs, and we're currently at 10 clubs. On the individual level, we hope to grow from 24 to 30 personal donors; at present, 13 Lions have already contributed. Thank you to everyone who has given so far—your generosity makes an incredible difference worldwide.
- New Club Development: We are aiming to charter a new club in our district. We're actively working in communities that could benefit from a Lions presence. If you know people interested in starting a club, please let me know—the district team will reach out to help them get started.

Another goal as District Governor is to visit every club in our district. Lion Lisa and I have enjoyed the energy, ideas, and enthusiasm we've seen so far. We're close to having all the clubs on our schedule, but a few clubs still need to provide or confirm dates.

Lions Clubs International (LCI) has transitioned to a **paperless billing system**, and paper invoices are **no longer being mailed** to clubs. All treasurers must now **log in to their LCI Member Portal (Lion Portal)** to view and download their club's invoices. Staying current with these digital statements is essential to ensure timely payments and maintain your club's good standing. Treasurers are encouraged to check the portal regularly for new invoices or updates, especially around quarterly billing dates. If you need assistance accessing your account or downloading invoices, contact LCI Accounts Receivable or our district leadership team for support.
